### GEORGIA-PACIFIC PRESENTS LEICHT WITH TWO DISTRIBUTION AWARDS

*Awards confirm Leicht as one of GP's top distribution centers nationwide*

GREEN BAY, WISC. – (Jan. 26, 2005) – Thanks to a dedicated workforce, customer collaboration and an investment in leading-edge technology in its warehouses, Leicht Transfer and Storage has been honored with two awards from its key customer, Georgia-Pacific.

One of the world's leading manufacturers of tissue, packaging, paper, pulp and related chemicals, Georgia-Pacific (GP) awarded Leicht its 2004 Service Award for outstanding service for GP's retail business, as well as its 2004 Inventory Accuracy Award for outstanding inventory management. Leicht was the only distribution center out of 54 GP distribution operations nationwide to receive each honor.

William L. Lambert, Director of Logistics for Georgia-Pacific, said, "Leicht's performance is the result of all facets of the operation functioning at a very high level of control with a focus on getting it right on each and every transaction."

In 2003, Leicht implemented a highly customized inventory management system that utilizes bar codes and radio-frequency transmission to accurately track 500 GP products in over one million square feet of its warehouse space dedicated to GP. Leicht warehouse employees use onboard Pocket PC computers with color touch screens to track information, including item numbers, quantities and location, while providing Leicht office staff with real-time visibility of every product movement. The system is extremely flexible and is designed to provide both web visibility of information and compatibility with RFID readers. An added benefit to Leicht's new processes and reporting is that it helps to ensure Sarbanes-Oxley compliance.

"All of us are extremely proud of these awards and see them as a result of the hard work of Leicht employees, combined with the use of the right technology," said Bob Johnson, CEO of RGL Holdings, Inc.

Leicht, a provider of supply chain services and part of Green Bay-based RGL Holdings, Inc., operates as Georgia-Pacific's distribution center in Green Bay.
